The role is a fixed term employment post for one year, with places funded by NHS England. These roles are temporary training positions initially; with progression to permanent offers, subject to the candidates meeting the service performance standards and university training. Recruitment is carried out jointly by the NHS Talking Therapies services and the University of Sheffield. The candidate must be deemed successful by both the LMWS Talking Therapies service and the NHS Talking Therapies University tutor to confirm a place on the university programme and secure a temporary employment post with LMWS.

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Successful candidates will be invited to a first stage interview with the service. Following first stage interviews, successful candidates will be invited back to a second stage interview with the University of Sheffield.
